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ALC (Area Learning Center)	Board Position Statement based on MSS 123A.30	Resident school of the member school of the ALC		<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Students must be attending a non-resident district on a full-time basis to be considered for participation in the League interscholastic programs.</li> <li>2. Students would be eligible only for the activity programs sponsored by the non-resident school district where the tuition is paid by the board of education of the resident district.</li> <li>3. If the non-resident district grants the degree, then League eligibility lies with the non-resident district.</li> <li>4. If the resident district grants the degree, then League eligibility resides with the resident district.</li> <li>5. The board of education of the resident district may accept only one option per agreement.</li> <li>6. All decisions must be made by July 1 of the year attending and cannot be revoked until the termination of the agreement.</li> <li>7. Students who attend a non-resident district must continue there during the life of the agreement between the two districts.</li> </ol>	123A.30
